Rules and Guidelines:

- Materials accepted for use: Wood, Fiberglass, Metal, Plastic, Rubber, Cardboard, Duct tape
- No glass, rusted metal, jagged edges or sharp parts
- No engines or motors,
- Battery operated parts okay as long as they are for decoration and not to help in sled performance
- No car hoods, car doors, car bumpers or other car body parts.
- No Canoes, boats or boat parts
- *Majority* of your materials must be salvaged materials. You will receive better judging if you use more re-used and re-cycled materials.
- Duct tape and cardboard are highly encouraged in construction
- Must be “sled worthy”. In other words, it has to work.
- Cannot be longer than ten feet and must be able to be carried by two people
- Official race name for toboggan required
- Entry form must be turned in by JAN. 29 OR SOONER (mail before 1/26)
- Constructed toboggan must be at the Groton Elementary School on January 29th by NOON (or earlier) RACE & JUDGING AT 1:00PM
- Must be present for race and judging to receive prizes
- No more than two people in toboggan on race day
- Return entry form with \$6.00, please make checks payable to the Village of Groton
